The HOA will be sponsoring not **ONE** but **TWO** Barbecue Block Parties this fall.


Weather permitting, on the evenings of September 11th and September 15th from 5-7 pm, we will

Emergency Preparedness: Are YOU Prepared?

Emergencies can happen anytime, and when disaster strikes, you may not be near friends, family, or members of your household. The best option is to be prepared by building an emergency plan and exploring the types of disasters that could occur. Possible disasters to consider include:

- Extreme heat
- Wildfires
- Flooding
- Drought
- Home Fires
- Power Outages
- Earthquakes
- Pandemics
- Mudslides & Landslides
- Thunderstorms & Lightning
- Volcanic Eruptions



Step 1: Discuss emergency preparedness with your family and household members.

- How will I receive emergency alerts and warnings?
- What is my shelter plan?
- What is my evacuation route?
- What is my family/household communication plan?
- Do I need to make or update my emergency preparedness kit?
- Do I know neighbors that might need help or that I could go to for help? (Tip in a large disaster, it is your neighbors and community members who will be there to assist first, so building those relationships now makes everyone stronger and more resilient for when disaster strikes.

Step 2: Consider specific needs for your household.

It is important to determine the type of supplies you need for your household. Sensitive populations such as older adults, children and pets require additional support or supplies. Factors to consider:

- Different ages of members within your household
- Responsibilities for assisting others
- Locations frequented
- Dietary needs
- Medical needs, including prescriptions and equipment
- Disabilities or access and functional needs, including devices and equipment
- Mobility and transportation needs
- Language/communication need

Step 3: Sign up for emergency alerts.

Sign up for emergency alerts both county-wide and in your locally to ensure you are receiving the most up-to-date information. Tip - sign up for alerts from communities where you or household members live <u>and</u> where you work!



Step 4: Practice your plan with your family/household.

Now that you have completed your family emergency plan, remember to practice the plan and ensure every family member understands what to do when disaster strikes.
