need to be removed from the curb by 6pm after pickup. Thank you for your cooperation.



## What to do with your old Christmas Tree

#### 1. Recycle it.

Collection will be the week of Jan 8-12.

Place your tree and wreath by your garbage collection area by 6 am. <u>Guidelines</u>

- Tree must be cut into 4 foot lengths or smaller
- Tree trunks should be no wider than 4 inches in diameter and each piece should weigh no more than 65 pounds.
- Remove all garland, tinsel and ornaments.
- No flocked trees, artificial trees or other debris will be accepted.
- Limit one tree and one wreath per household.

### 2. Use it for firewood

Converting a Christmas tree to firewood means the tree can continue making spirits bright long after the holiday is over. Experts warn, however, not to simply toss your old tree into an indoor fireplace or wood stove. A hazardous chemical called creosote in the trees can build up and cause fires to burn extremely hot, sending off sparks that can be fire hazards.

However, it's perfectly fine to use your tree as kindling for an outdoor fire pit.

#### 3. Mulch it

Save yourself a trip to the store, not to mention all that cash you'd have spent buying bags of mulch.

#### 4. Compost it

Use your old Christmas tree to supplement your garden soil. A layer of thin branches — such as evergreens — is the best base for a new compost pile.

#### 5. Use it to protect your perennials

Your old Christmas tree can help save the lives of the other plants in your garden. Simply lay the branches on the ground beneath perennial plants to help protect them from any upcoming frost.

#### 6. Toss it into your fish tank

Want to create a peaceful habitat for your fish? Place branches from your old Christmas tree inside their tank. According to Lifehack: "In the wild, many branches fall into ponds and lakes, offering protection to the fish in the water. You can put the smaller branches into the tank to give your fish a place to hide and relax. Make sure the branches are fully clean before you put them in the tank." (www.lifehack.org)

## Summary of Board Meeting— December 4, 2018

**Financial:** Mr. Ellis reviewed the October and November Financial statements for the Association. The directors reviewed and discussed several of the expenses, including those related to the new neighbor welcome packages.

Mr. Ellis then reviewed the upcoming Christmas Lighting contest. He affirmed that the judging and prizes will be made on December 21. Cash is to be awarded to the first second and third place winners; in the respective amounts of \$300.00, \$200.00, and \$100.00. Lastly, Mr. Ellis reported that the long standing vacant home located on 809 52nd street recently sold and closed.

**Architectural Control**: Mr. Surber reported most of the deficiencies noted by the ACC were being taken care of by the homeowners that have received second notices.

**Welcoming Committee:** Mr. Ellis reviewed the actions and activities of the Welcome Committee. New homeowners were provided with a package including City of Auburn key contact, points of interest, and resources, ACC Guidelines, as well as gift certificates to local Lake Hills Town Center business'. These gift packages were paid for with funds received from the Title Transfer fee charged to the purchasers of new homes in the association, and hand delivered by two of the HOA members.

**Newsletter:** It is scheduled to go out in early January 2019. Topics to include a reminder of 2019 HOA Dues, timing of when garbage, yard waste, and recycle bins could be placed curbside, and a request for ACC volunteers.

**Adjournment:** Board of Directors meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
